

# Cardboard Boat Race

Oxford, Maryland

## Rules of Construction

as passed down from generations of BBI members

The rules are simple for building a qualifying boat for the Cardboard Boat Races in Oxford, Maryland:

- 1) Any form of paddles is permitted (one paddle per person in the boat).
- 2) Cardboard, no restrictions, can be used – cardboard may be waxed.
- 3) Up to three (3) board feet of lumber may be used, per person, in construction of the boat. Wood may be used for framing, stiffening and fastening cardboard.

*Boats are intended to be inexpensive and biodegradable.*

Note: One (1) board foot is a piece of wood as follows:

- a) 1" thick X 12" wide X 12" long (i.e. 144 cubic inches)
- b) 1" thick X 1" wide X 12 feet long (i.e. 144 cubic inches)

Three (3) board feet is a piece of wood as follows:

- a) 1" thick X 1" wide X 36' long
- b) .75" thick X .5" wide X 48' long
- c) .5" thick X .5" wide X 144' long

- 4) Rope or string may be used.
- 5) Fasteners used may be staples, nails, bolts or tape (duct, masking, scotch & gaffer).
- 6) All glue, paint, cement, sealers, etc. must be water based.
- 7) **All contestants and persons on the craft must wear life jackets.**
- 8) NO metal oarlocks, NO motors, NO epoxy of any kind, NO oil based paints and NO plastics.

Now you're ready for some fun! Be creative.
